### GUARDIAN BUILDING

An Art Deco masterpiece in the heart of downtown featuring vibrant tiles, Tiffany Glass, and colorful marble.

### RIVERWALK | CULLEN PLAZA

Detroit's riverfront hub and core part of the expanding recreational pathway, providing the best views of the waterway and Windsor, ON, Canada.

### HEIDELBERG PROJECT

An ever-evolving, award-winning art environment on the city's east side, created in 1986 by the artist Tyree Guyton to have a positive impact on his neighborhood.

### CAMPUS MARTIUS PARK

Detroit's "point of origin" and "#1 Public Space in the U.S." The park was dedicated in 2004 and has performances and programming all year long.

### INDIAN VILLAGE

Historic mansion district featuring early 20th century homes designed by famed architects such as Albert Kahn and Louis Kamper.

### MICHIGAN CENTRAL STATION

An impressive architectural feat - built in 1913, the famed station was vacant for several decades before its current, massive redevelopment.

### AVENUE OF FASHION

One of Detroit's most famous retail corridors and home to the city's thriving Black Business District featuring great boutiques, restaurants, and galleries.

### CLARK PARK

Park and gathering space in Detroit's Mexicantown neighborhood, offering youth and community programming year round.

### FISHER BUILDING

Frequently called Detroit's largest art object, this 1929 building is home to offices, unique shops, a theater, and more than 40 different types of marble.

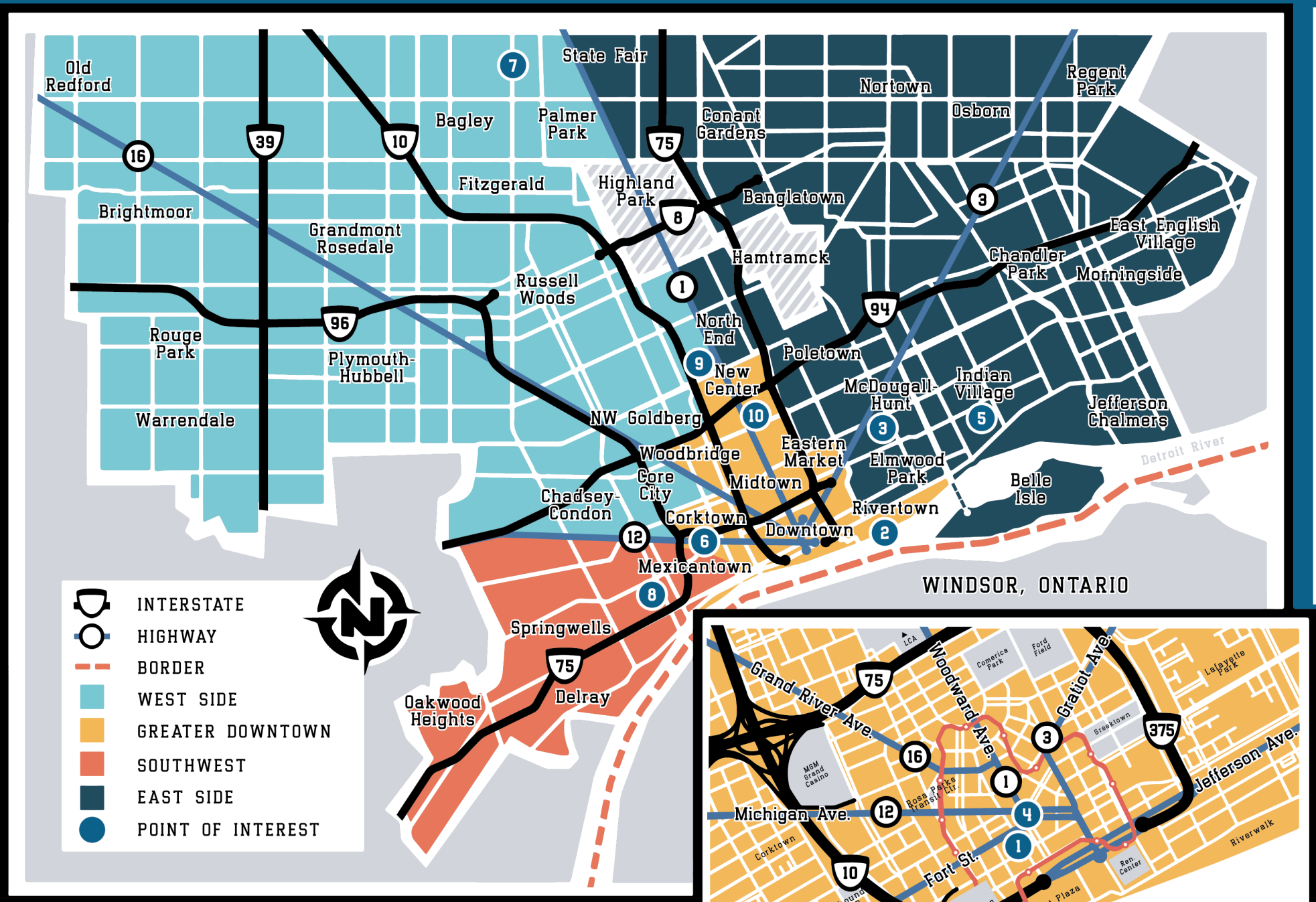
